## The history of Awataha Marae

Awataha basically means “The river flowing at the side”. It’s a place at Shoal Bay on the northern headland of the basin Te Kopua o Mata Kamokamo. The place is part of the site of an ancient papakainga or village---Te Korekore---settled perhaps a thousand years ago and occupied until 1923 by the Kawerau people. It is known that the Kawerau suffered greatly at the hands of invading tribes but returned to their ancestral land to re-establish their papakainga.

## Introduction to Awataha

Awataha Marae is a community organization. It consists of the place and its peoples. It is very much a vibrant entity with a head a heart and a body. The Marae is the heart, steeped in a rich spiritual and cultural heritage. While Awataha is described as an "urban Marae" its roots are in both its people and its spiritual antecedents. While it is connected this way it will always have its heritage.

Most importantly, Awataha is connected to its spiritual head, Tane Whakapiripiri - he himself is the gatherer and connector of people - *he tangata, he tangata, he tangata*. Our communities include Maori on the North Shore of Auckland New Zealand, Maori connected to Maori on the North Shore and people on the North Shore. Yet we seek to connect to all people and all communities.


## AWATAHA MARAE EXPERIENCE
